The North Lambton Childcare Centre (NLCC) is an incorporated, non-profit organization governed by a volunteer Board of Directors and funded by the Ministry of Education, the County of Lambton, Ministry of Children and Youth Services, and parent user fees for child care services.

## Description of Programs and Services

#### North Lambton Childcare Centre Programs

North Lambton Childcare Centre promotes an Emergent Curriculum philosophy in our early childhood classrooms in a nurturing and secure environment. There are equal opportunities for children to participate and benefit from their play experiences to promote individual learning and development. Activities are planned around those interests and offers continuous opportunities for exploration, discovery, choice, and decision making.

#### **Ontario Early Years Centre**

The Ontario Early Years Centre, Lambton-Kent-Middlesex is designed to meet the unique needs of families and caregivers with children prenatal to age six. Programs are designed to help parents and caregivers enhance their parenting skills and improve their understanding of children's developmental needs. The programs provide children with opportunities to play and explore their environment. Trained professionals understand that through documentation, learning occurs through play. With programs that are free of charge and available in many communities, the OEYC works with other community agencies to help children reach their full potential.
